Steven, who suffered severe injuries in 2008 causing him to lose both his legs, moved into a home provided by Homes for Our Troops last year. Steven accepted the check on behalf of Homes for Our Troops, saying "Homes for Our Troops depends on donations from organizations like Navy Federal and contributions from volunteers in local communities all over the country. Please know that this donation is appreciated."

Homes for Our Troops is a national non-profit organization founded in 2004 that is strongly committed to helping severely injured servicemen and women and their immediate families. The organization raises money, procures materials and professional labor, and coordinates the construction of specially designed homes that allow them to live independently at no cost to the veteran.
